PANTHERS @ SEA was Saturday, May 11th, 8am from Alamitos Bay starting from the green area by



Long Beach Yacht Club at the end of Ap-pian Way. Boats were marshaled at the LBYC Long Dock. The coffee and donuts were again a hit. The Burger Bash for helpers, skippers and crew was at Seal Beach YC after the event. Ruth & David and Heidi & David had a handle on the getting the food, water, etc. Pat Wilks worked with getting the skippers.

With the boats congregated at Long Beach YC, the logistics for that part of the event were easier. There was a shuttle boat to Seal Beach YC for the Burger Bash afterwards for those skippers and crew that want to leave their boats at the Long Dock until after the Bash. I was on the photo boat which was a 20' RIB inflatable provided by US Sailing Center with Mike Segerbloom at the helm. At times it strongly resembled a "Bounce House". We did stop at Parker's Lighthouse for refreshments and Mike wound up pulling "Sea Angel" off of the shoaling in the Queens

Way Channel. Stay in between the channel markers if you draw more than 2 feet. It can be only 5 or 6 feet deep or more in some places. The river silts it in easily.

All in all, it was a nice day for the Panther's event. Light winds to start, plenty of sun and the wind didn't come up until time to come back to the dock. There were many happy faces after.

A cruise coming up is the **Cruise to the Corsair YC facility at Emerald Bay** at Catalina. The weekend of June 28-30. Emerald is my favorite place at Catalina when it is warm, little tidal surge and the water is clear and warm. A great place to snorkel around Indian Rock and the other rocks there. The Corsair facility is nice with facilities and a nice BBQ and picnic area. This is a cruise with several YC's and is a good place to meet other boaters.

The trip to brush up our knowledge of the Local Marine Species is **Saturday, June 8th** meeting at the **Cabrillo Marine Aquarium** at 10am. After a couple hours of looking and learning there, we will head up to the **Marine Mammal Care Center** up by the Ft MacArthur Museum. There we will see the Seals and Sea Lions that are under rehab. Care there. Parking at the Aquarium is \$1 per hour, free at the MMCC. Both facilities accept donations. Both places are very interesting and I challenge you to not learn something. The Aquarium has many exhibits covering the fish, mammals and other life in the local waters. See the big Spiny Lobster or the Octopus, whale display, local fish, etc. The Nursery raises replenishment fish and shelled life like Abalone and Oysters. Both facilities are educational on the species there and how cared for in the case of the Pinnipeds.

After visiting those facilities, if you are hungry or thirsty, we can stop at a Brewery or two in San Pedro. Details on the flier.

Join us for a fun Day!

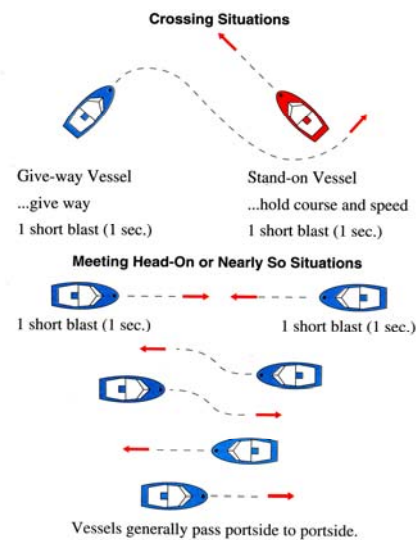
Dave & Julie will be the program at the June 11th Meeting. They will present their adventures down the coast to Panama and the canal.

NAUTICAL QUESTION: WHAT ARE NAVIGATION RULES?

The Navigation Rules establish actions to be taken by vessels to avoid collision. The Rules are divided into two parts, INLAND and INTERNATIONAL. Inland Rules apply to vessels operating inside the line of demarcation while International apply outside. Demarcation lines are printed on most navigational charts and are published in the Navigation Rules.

The Operator of a vessel 12 meters or greater is responsible for having on board and maintaining a copy of the Inland Navigation Rules. The following diagrams describe the whistle signals and action to be taken by vessels in a crossing, meeting or overtaking while operating in inland waters.

The Port of Long Beach recently welcomed the Daniel K. Inouye (DKI), the largest container ship ever built in the U.S. The vessel is named in honor of the late U.S. senator, a decorated U.S. Army veteran who represented Hawaii for more than 50 years and was an ardent supporter of the U.S. maritime industry. Weighing more than 51,400 metric tons, the 850-foot long vessel is Matson's largest and fastest ship, with a 3,600-TEU (twenty-foot equivalent unit) capacity and a top speed of nearly 24 knots. The new vessel also incorporates green ship technology, including a more fuel-efficient hull design, dual fuel engines that can be adapted to run on liquefied natural gas (LNG), and fresh water ballast systems.

Cruises coming up include the Cruise to Emerald Bay at Corsair YC facility June 28-30. If interested, contact Bruce.

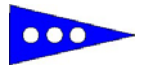
I want input if any of you would like to get a group together in July and take the Express to Catalina for a day, to either 2 Harbors or Avalon. Let me know.

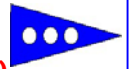

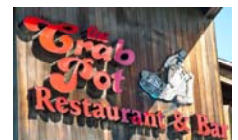

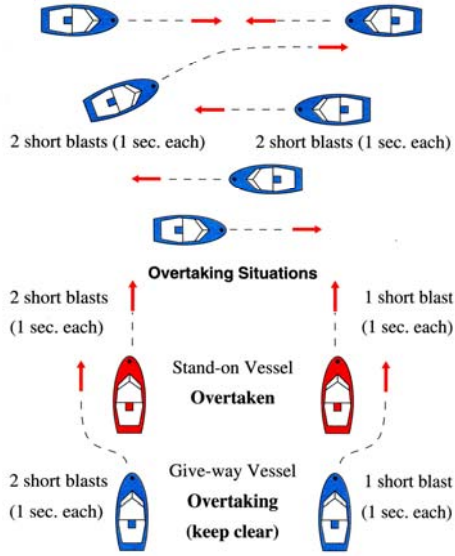
